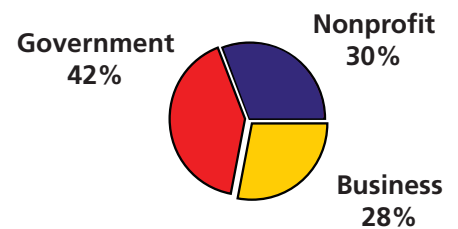


# Evaluation Results

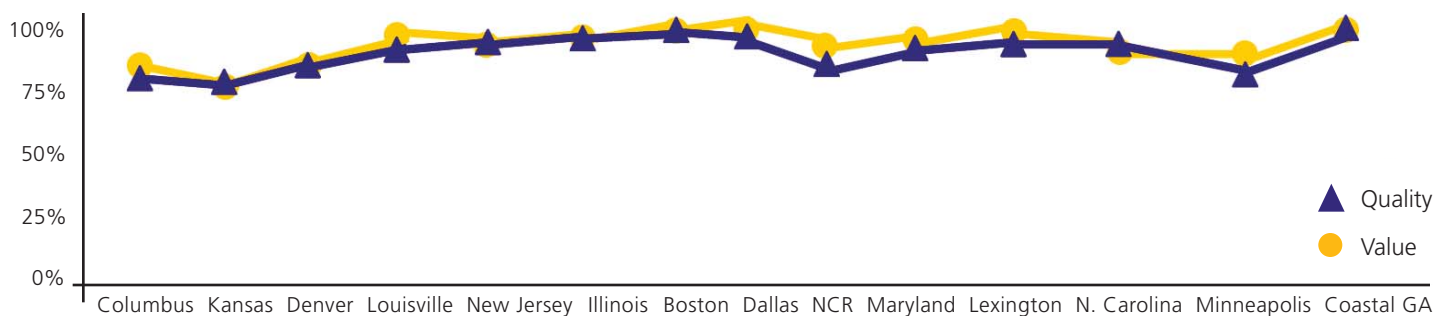


## Are the right number and type of people attending?

- > 1,776 business, government, and nonprofit leaders have attended a Summit
- > 496 individuals attended from the business sector, 749 attended from the government sector, and 522 attended from the nonprofit sector

## Do participants like the Summit?

- > 92% of respondents reported that the Summit was a valuable use of time
- > 89% of respondents rated the overall quality of the Summit as “good” or “outstanding”



## Do participants attend and like the Post-Summit Activity?

- > 560 business, government, and nonprofit leaders have attended a Post-Summit Activity
- > 89% of respondents reported that the Post-Summit Activity was a valuable use of time

## To what degree are participants applying Meta-Leadership-related knowledge and skills to their preparedness and response-related work?

- > 87% of respondents reported using Meta-Leadership concepts or principles approximately six months after the Summit. Of these, 94% reported it has made a positive difference for them and/or their organization
- > The majority of respondents reported that as a result of attending the Summit, they have built connections with other attendees, identified new assets and resources to assist in preparedness efforts, and provided assistance/information to others

## Are there specific examples of improved preparedness or response at the state or local level?

Since the Summit, respondents have:

- > Attended preparedness and emergency response-related multi-sector meetings
- > Networked, built relationships, and collaborated with other Summit attendees
- > Created or revised preparedness plans and/or continuity of operations plans
- > Shared meta-leadership concepts and principles with others
